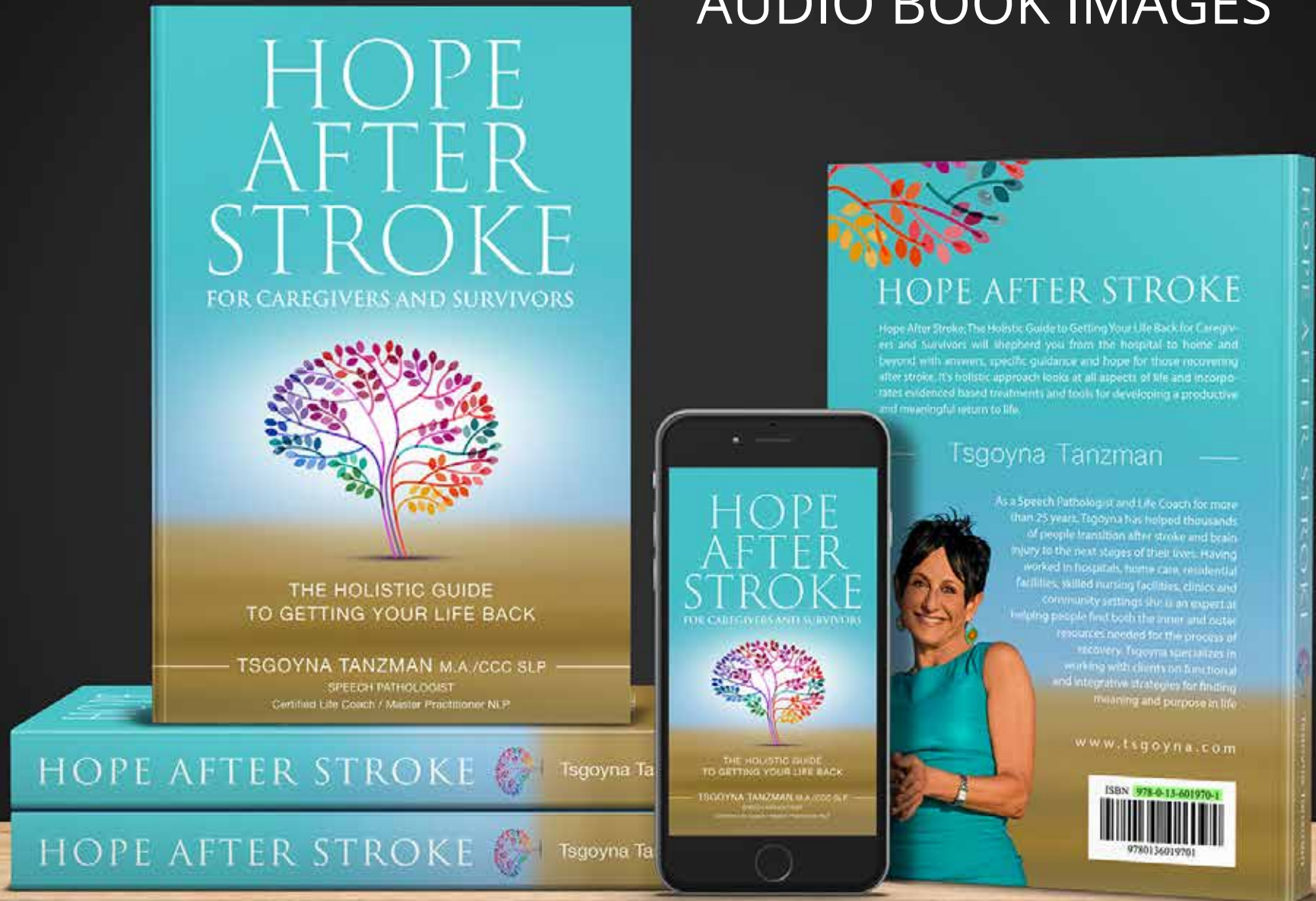

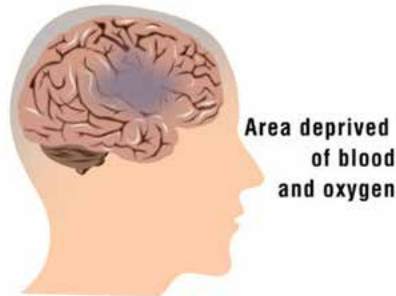

VESSELS SHOWING DIFFERENCE BETWEEN OBSTRUCTION (BLOCK) AND WEAKENING (BLEED)

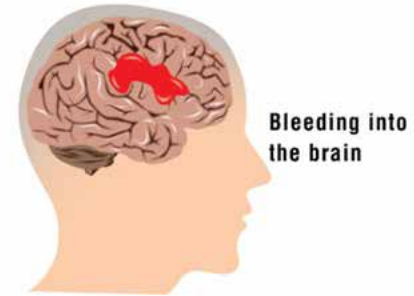

Hemorrhagic stroke



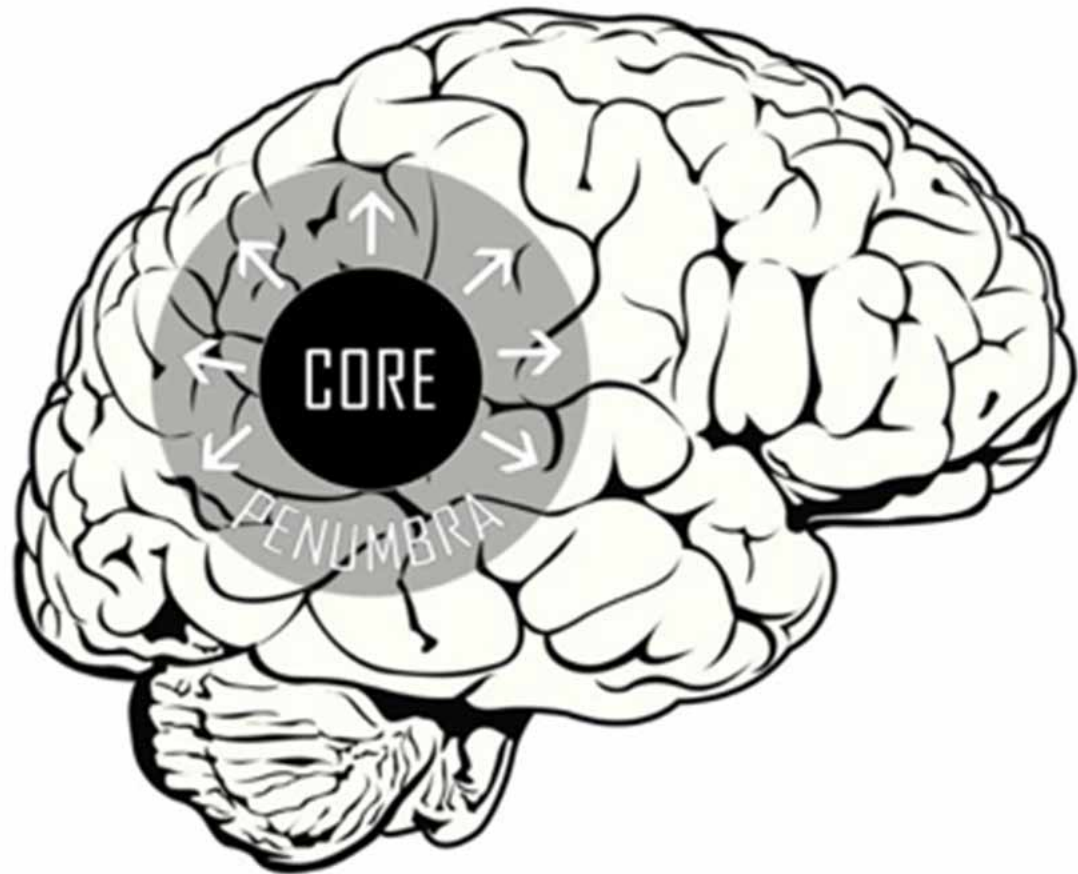

Two types of hemorrhagic stroke

TWO TYPES OF HEMORRHAGIC STROKE		
Type	Location	Cause
Intracerebral	Bleeding <i>within</i> the brain	High blood pressure. Burst aneurysm within the brain.
Subarachnoid	The area between the brain and the skull. It is filled with cerebrospinal fluid (CSF), which acts as a floating cushion to protect the brain.	An artery on or near the surface of brain bursts. May be genetic and present at birth. Falls or other head trauma.
